The 21st meeting of the State Level sanctioning Committee (SLSC) of RKVY-RAFTAAR was held on 04th October 2019, in Vidhana Soudha, Room No.334, Conference Hall under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary, Government of Karnataka. The list of invitees present in the meeting is annexed.

The Member Secretary and the Commissioner for Agriculture welcomed the Chairman and all the SLSC invitees to the meeting.

With the permission of the Chair, the items listed in the agenda were taken up and the following is the record of the proceedings and decisions taken.

AGENDA SUBJECT - 1

**Confirmation of the Proceedings of SLSC meeting on RKVY held on
30th April 2019**

The Member Secretary informed that the Proceedings of the State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) meeting of RKVY held on 30th April 2019 was circulated among all the member departments/institutions vide letter number RKVY/20th SLSC/2019-20 dated 09th May 2019. Till date neither any objection to any of the part of proceedings, nor any suggestion to amend any part of the proceedings has been received.

Decision: The record of proceedings of the SLSC meeting held on 30.04.2019 is confirmed.

AGENDA SUBJECT - 2**Action taken report on decisions of the 20th SLSC meeting of RKVY held on
30th April 2019**

The Committee noted the action taken on the first three points of this agenda. As regards the fourth, which related to implementation of the RKVY scheme in 2019-20, the Committee noted with concern that Fisheries department had not utilized any amount of the Rs.6.22 crores released under Normal-RKVY. It also directed the Departments of Animal Husbandry, Horticulture, Sericulture and Watershed Development to utilise the released amount at the earliest, so that Government of India may be requested to release further instalments. With regards to two sub-schemes under RKVY, Additional Fodder Development Programme and Crop Diversification Programme, the Committee directed that the funds be utilised early and funds under the sub-scheme Reclamation of Problem Soils, be released at the earliest.

AGENDA SUBJECT - 3

2019-20 RKVY Programme and approval of additional projects

The Member Secretary informed that the previous State Level Project Screening Committee (SLPSC) for RKVY headed by the Additional Chief Secretary and Development Commissioner, which met on 01st February 2019, considered the 2018-19 allocation of Rs.198 crores and recommended projects amounting to Rs.226.06 crores. As against these, 39 projects amounting to Rs.163.974 crores were approved in the 20th SLSC held on 30th April 2019.

Besides these 39, five projects of University of Agricultural Sciences, Bengaluru, amounting to Rs.9.38 crores, which were given conditional sanction in the 20th SLSC have been cleared by Government of India.

The final allocation under RKVY for 2019-20 done by the Government of India is Rs.298.93 crores (Central share Rs.179.36 crores + State share Rs.119.57 crores).

In order to utilize the balance amount of Rs.134.956 crores, which is the difference between final allocation and the total cost of projects sanctioned in the previous SLSC, additional projects were called for and placed before the SLPSC in the meeting held on 21st May 2019 and were approved for submission to Government of India. In it, 74 projects totalling to Rs.335.5012 crores were approved to be submitted to the Government of India. Of these, 72 projects were submitted to the Government of India on 04th June 2019. Two projects of the Sericulture department were not sent as per their request. Later 5 more projects were sent to the Government of India. The total number of projects sent is thus 77.

The Government of India has, in its meeting held on 12th September 2019, rejected 8 projects which amount to Rs.24.25 crores, approved 34 projects which amount to Rs.206.807 crores without revisions, 13 projects which amount to Rs.62.234 crores with the condition of revision of DPR and was not able to take a decision on 21 projects which amount to Rs.50.138 crores for want of preliminary/final remarks of the

ICAR/MNCFC/Divisions of the Ministry of Agriculture. One project of the department of Horticulture was considered by the Government of India under RKVY sub-scheme.

The present availability of funds is Rs.138.609 crores as indicated in the table below.

These approvals are subject to the following conditions/instructions-

1. The department of Watershed Development should implement the project of Construction of check dams through Watershed Committees only.
2. The Department of Agriculture:
 - a) May request religious philanthropic institutions to run the Custom Hire Service Centres.
 - b) In case of seed farms, the department should try to refrain from producing seeds on their own. Rather they should try to hand-over seed farms to specialist institutions like the Karnataka State Seeds Corporation and Karnataka Oilseeds Federation. Javalagere farm model can be adopted for this.
 - c) In case of the Mobile Plant Health Clinic project, vehicles should be non-passenger models and having GPS tracking facilities. There should be regular

monitoring and documentations of the journeys of these vehicles by the Joint Directors of Agriculture.

- d) Besides these, the Committee directed that the department should keep the Raita Sampark Kendras (RSK) as much free from the activity of sale of agricultural inputs as possible. As a first, the department should provide licences to market seeds to all (nearly 3000 are reported to be active) Primary Agricultural Co-operative Society (PACS) outlets. He directed the Principal Secretary, Cooperation, and the Commissioner for Agriculture to jointly take early action in this regard.
- e) With regards to sale of Fertilizers and Insecticides, the Committee directed that short-term courses required for an individual to get licences for these be provided A special drive to be conducted in collaboration with MANAGE, KVKs and Agriculture Universities to enrol all PACS' Secretaries to Diploma courses which is a pre requisite for getting fertilizer and pesticide licence. The Departments of Agriculture and Co-operation should join hands to jointly sponsor course fees for PACS' secretaries.
- f) Animal Husbandry Department should focus on Fodder Development and distribute seeds through Milk societies. They should also roll out the software for medicine procurement and distribution.
- g) Agriculture Universities and KVKs should take-up Integrated Farming System (IFS) demonstration not just on their Campuses but on farmer's fields.
- h) Universities and Departments to make short videos of 3 to 5 minutes duration regarding IFS, other innovative technologies and share through WhatsApp and other social media with farmers.

As the total cost of these projects is more than the fund available, the Chairman authorized the Additional Chief Secretary and Development Commissioner to decide on the projects to be sanctioned immediately, which are to be kept in the pipeline and the priority in which those in pipeline are to be taken up on receipt of funds from the GoI later.

Decision: The Committee accorded approval for implementing RKVY Sub-Scheme "Area Expansion of Cashew" during 2019-20 with the department wise action plan being as follows-

AGENDA SUBJECT - 5**Miscellaneous other proposals****A. Animal Husbandry Department:**

- a) *Decision: The SLSC Committee accorded approval for the utilisation of savings of Rs.14.33 lakhs in Gokul Gram for Deoni and Malnad Gidda cattle breed conservation project of the year 2015-16 for purchase of cattle feed and maintenance of Animals.*
- b) *Decision: The SLSC Committee approved the implementation of the project related to supply of liquid nitrogen silos in 14 districts instead of the previously approved 8, with changed capacity without any additional financial allocation.*

B. Sericulture Department:

Decision: The Committee accorded approval for utilisation of savings of Rs.52.00 lakhs (Rs.11.00 lakhs revalidated amount of 2017-18 and Rs.41.00 lakhs of unspent balance of 2018-19) for the project "Supply of bamboo mountages (chandrikes) for pure Mysore seed rearers".

C. Directorate of Cashew Research Puttur:

Decision: The Committee approved the modified Detailed Project Report and utilisation of Rs.1.043 crores of unspent amounts of 2018-19 in the year 2019-20.

D. UHS Bagalkot:

Decision: The Committee accorded approval to use savings of Rs 1 crore available in other RKVY projects of the UHS Bagalkot as additionality for the project "Establishment of Centre for Research and Development on potato and sweet potato."

E. UAS Dharwad:

Decision: The Committee approved the utilisation of savings of Rs.0.29 crores in the project "Intervention through Nano Science and Technology in Crop improvement and Crop Husbandry practices" of 2013-14 for the project "Evaluation of Chitosan based Nano practices in plant health management".

F. Utilization of interest accrued in RKVY bank accounts:

Decisions:

A. The SLSC accorded permission to utilize accrued interest amount for new projects with the concurrence of the Government of India, including the project titled “Establishment of Agri-Innovation Centre” of Rs. 20 crores, submitted for consideration to the Government of India.

B. Bio-Innovation centre to be re-named as “Farm Innovation Centre” and work not only on Agriculture, but also other allied sectors. Different Institutions working with farming sector like Agriculture/Horticulture / Animal Husbandry/ Fisheries Universities and IIHR should tie-up with Farm Innovation Centre.

G. Implementation of Drought Proofing Action Plan in Kolar, Tumkur, Vijayapura, and Belagavi Districts:

Decision: The Committee approved the proposal in principle and decided to withdraw Belagavi and add proposal for Kalaburgi District. This approval is subject to additional funds being allocated by the Government of India.

H. Karnataka State Seeds Corporation:

Decision: The Committee directed the State Government to explore availability of funds for this project from any other scheme of the state sector.

I. Agriculture Marketing:

Decision: The Committee approved revision of its sanction for the project of Grameena Santhe to Rs.3.45 crores as per Government of India comments.

J. Reallocation of funds surrendered by Sericulture Department :

Decision: Rs.1.479 crores re-allocated to Animal Husbandry Department for the project “Integrated Piggery Development Programme.


